Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding agency action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take pursuant to a consent agreement in Board case 5.035.17. The proposed action is to require completion of a medication administration education course and payment of a \$250 fine. The licensee wrongly administered 40 units of Aspart Insulin to patient when the physician ordered 28 units of Lantus Insulin and 12 units Aspart Insulin. The licensee notified the physician of the medication error, and the patient was given three doses of instaglucoase and one unit of glucagon to remedy the error.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act, 59 O.S.2011 & Supp.2016, §§ 567.1–567.20, authorizes “corrective actions” when nurses violate the Act or its implementing administrative rules, *see* 59 O.S.Supp.2016, § 567.8a. The Act prohibits nurses from “[f]ail[ing] to adequately care for patients or to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing” in a way that “unnecessarily exposes a patient or other person to risk of harm.” 59 O.S.Supp.2016, § 567.8(B)(3). This action seeks to enforce requirements aimed at ensuring patients receive adequate nursing care, including receiving physician-ordered medications in a timely and accurate manner. The Board may reasonably believe that requiring additional education and imposing a fine, under the conditions detailed above, will protect patients from inadequate nursing care.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion this action advances the State of Oklahoma’s policy to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring nurses provide proper care to patients.
