

ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINION 2016-745A

Dear Executive Director Dockum:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding agency action that the Oklahoma Motor Vehicle Commission intends to take with respect to new motor vehicle dealer licensee 423. The proposed action is to impose—pursuant to a consent agreement—a fine of \$250 for displaying a vehicle off the licensed premises at a prohibited location.

Oklahoma law authorizes the Oklahoma Motor Vehicle Commission to "impose a fine not to exceed . . . [\$1,000] against a dealer per occurrence" for several reasons, including violation of statutory requirements. 47 O.S.Supp.2016, § 565(A), (A)(3). Oklahoma law elsewhere makes clear that a dealer is licensed at a specific location. 47 O.S.Supp.2016, § 564(D). Further, Oklahoma places clear restrictions on when vehicles may be displayed away from the licensed location. See 47 O.S.Supp.2016, § 564.1. One restriction bars a display that is not in the "dealer's factory-approved area of sales and service responsibility." Id. § 564.1(A)(3). The Legislature has clearly spoken to this issue, and the action seeks to advance the Legislature's policy. The Commission may reasonably believe that a modest fine will adequately deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Motor Vehicles Commission has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State of Oklahoma's policy regarding the locations where dealers may display new vehicles.
